"Mandating risk assessments of this very low risk group would have no more public protection benefit than mandating risk assessments of all men in Connecticut.

There is strong evidence that the risk of sexual offending for individuals who have been 20 years sexual offence free in the community is very low, equivalent to the ambient base rate of first-time sexual offending in the general male population. Furthermore, there is no evidence concerning any individual characteristics that would increase that risk. Evaluators charged with risk assessment of individuals who have been sexual offence free for 20 years would be blind, i.e., without the benefit of evidence to guide their decisions." - 2023
